Autism Services offered at Neuro-Behavioural Clinic

The Neuro-Behavioural Clinic offers services to children and youths between 5 to 19 years old, who are diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) or an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

Our Autism Services include:

INDIVIDUAL PROGRAMS

- Diagnosis and Assessment
- Parent Education
- Individualized intervention in areas including anxiety management, self-organization and social skills etc.
- Psychological Management of co-morbid mental health issues
- Pharmacological Management of co-morbid mental health issues
- Referral to community resources or consultation with schools

GROUP PROGRAMS

- Groups addressing emotion regulation such as Anxiety and Anger Management
- Transition groups e.g. From Primary 6 to Sec 1
- Social Skills programs



What are Autism Spectrum Disorders?

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) are a range of developmental disorders of the brain characterized as:

- Difficulties in socializations
- Difficulties in communication
- Restricted or repetitive pattern of behaviors and interests

It is estimated that 1 out of 150 children today have some form of ASD.



Some common symptoms of ASD

Individuals with ASD present differently, but some of these signs that warrant further investigation include:

- Avoidance of eye-contact
- Solitary, prefers to be alone
- Have trouble understanding other's feelings or talking about their own
- No interest in others or have trouble relating to others
- Repeats certain behaviors in the same manner
- Laughs or cries without apparent reason
- Unusual way of playing or no play
- Have difficulty with changes in schedule or routine

Individuals with ASD may also present with difficulties in other aspects such as anxiety, eating problems and learning disabilities.
